### Water taste test

Candelo water is the best tasting water in the Shire, according to a taste test by Council employees this week. Council's water teams provided samples from their towns' systems for the taste test taken by 51 staff members who commented on taste and smell.

The test was the run up to the Water Industry Operations Australia's NSW conference in Orange later this month where the Best Tasting Drinking Water in NSW will be announced.

Candelo water team will be defending the title won by Bega Valley Shire Council last year with a sample from a staff member's kitchen sink in Kalaru. A close runner up to Candelo in our taste test was Eden.

### **Work on Small Blue Pool**

The small pool at the Bermagui Blue Pool has been drained in preparation for substantial work to repair the leaking structural concrete lining of the rock pool.

The lining was given a "band-aid" repair last year to keep it open while the main pool was undergoing refurbishment over the summer.

Council is now investigating the best way to repair the extensive leaking in the pool lining and work is expected to begin soon.

### **Problem waste**

Good news this week from the Member for Bega Andrew Constance that Council will receive \$146,077 for a Waste Less, Recycle More initiative from the NSW Environmental Trust.

The grant will be used to provide a household problem-waste drop off centre, the Merimbula Community Recycling Centre, where residents can drop off their problem waste, including paint, gas bottles and batteries.

This will be free of charge. Council also plans to provide a mobile collection service for residents living in more remote areas across the shire. More news on that later.

### Wonboyn project

The Wonboyn boat ramp and jetty reconstruction project is entering its final stage with the completion of the boat ramp and pontoon jetty. The civil works to enlarge the launching area and upgrade the carpark are also nearing completion.

The asphalt sealing of the carpark is scheduled for next Tuesday and Wednesday which will necessitate closure to the public for those two days. The final works will be linemarking and signage, with the facility open and operational by Friday, 20 March!

### **Burning off**

The Rural Fire Service has declared the end of the statutory Bush Fire Danger Period for the Far South Coast a month early due to favourable conditions.

From this week, fire permits will no longer be required in the Shire, however residents will still have to notify their neighbours and the local fire authority 24 hours before burning off.

People living in towns should check with Council and Fire and Rescue NSW regarding appropriate approvals.

It is important that people check whether they need a Bush Fire Hazard Reduction Certificate and that they have enough equipment to control or contain the fire on their property.

To arrange a Bush Fire Hazard Reduction Certificate, or a free assessment, contact your local Fire Control Centre on 6494 7400.
