

Congratulations to us!

Council is very pleased to be named winner of a prestigious Green Globe Award for the Tathra Community Solar Farm, a joint project of Council and the community organisation, Clean Energy for Eternity. The project won the Climate Change Leadership category of the awards which recognise environmental excellence, leadership and innovation.

As one of Australia's first community solar farms, the project is both practical and aesthetic, creating a working solar farm generating electricity and an art installation. The 30 kilowatts ground-mounted solar installation, arranged to form the word 'IMAGINE', can be clearly seen by passing flights. The energy generated by the panels offsets electricity used by the Council-owned Tathra sewerage treatment plant and money saved is placed into a fund managed by CEFE for future community

Weed control programs

The roadside and public land weed control programs from now to December are in place. Spot-spraying of weeds may be carried out in other areas as appropriate. Weed control as part of general maintenance of roads and road shoulders may be carried out in other areas as part of the roads program. The weed program is dependent on weather conditions and contractor availability and may be varied according to weed growth. For more information, contact Council.

- African lovegrass. Bega, Brogo, Bemboka, Pambula, Princes highway to the Victorian border, Wyndham, Burragate, Eden, Towamba, Rocky Hall areas roadsides and Council reserves.
- St John's Wort. Candelo, Bemboka, Brogo, Wandellla, Yowrie, Coolagolite, Cobargo and Bega areas roadsides and Council reserves.

Nethercote market

Library Portal opens

As part of the transition to a new library in Tura Beach, Council will open a library portal in Merimbula from today, Friday 23 October. The library portal will offer a selection of quality library services including access to the library catalogue and an ability to reserve and pick up library items.

The portal will be open on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9.30am to 5pm, and will operate from the Council's newly acquired Regional Learning Facility in Cabarita Place, Merimbula. In addition to the reservation and pick up service, visitors to the portal will be able to access newspapers and magazines, an area for reading and studying, and a space for kids. Free WiFi and public access computers will be available shortly.

Merimbula road works

If you are planning going to Merimbula next week, be aware that there will be delays caused by road works in Lake Street from Monday 26 October for about one month between 7am and 5pm (weather permitting). There will be single lane traffic for the duration of works and delays can be expected so you should avoid driving in the area if possible. Get bush fire ready

The Far South Coast Rural Fire Service will hold bush fire information sessions at the Bermagui, Bega, Merimbula and Eden libraries over the coming weeks. The sessions will be held from 12.30pm at Bermagui Library on 28 October; 12.30pm at Bega Library on 4 November; 12.30pm at the Merimbula Library Portal and 3.30pm at Eden Library on 11 November.

There will be information on how to make a Bush Fire Survival Plan using the Rural Fire Service mobile and tablet app with paper based plans also available on the day.

The Library will have iPads with the RFS app pre-installed for attendees to build their own plans and print them out to take home. Participants are welcome to bring their own devices. The Bush Fire Survival Plans will be available at the libraries in the week of the information session for those unable to attend.

Community Safety Officer from the Far South Coast Rural Fire Service, Martin Webster, said the aim of the sessions is to break down misconceptions and help people get their plans into a useable format.
