Recycling numbers

Many residents, when visiting our transfer stations and landfills with their recycling, ask what plastics we can recycle within the Bega Valley Shire. When you look underneath any kind of plastic container/bottle etc you will see the recycle symbol with a number inside it.

Each type of plastic is given a unique number, 1 through to 7.

Transpacific Cleanaway is contracted to collect all our recycling and send it off for processing, so we asked Glenn at Cleanaway for the definitive word on permissible recycling within our Shire.

You CAN recycle any numbers 1 through to 5.

You CANNOT recycle numbers 6 and 7 – these tend to be styrofoam-type plastics, like the trays we often find used for meats, or styrofoam boxes. These types of plastics will have to be put in your red bin for disposal.

If you find you have some 6 or 7 type of plastics, perhaps you could find a way to re-use them, to keep them out of landfill for a bit longer. For example, many child care centres like using well cleaned meat trays for paints and crafts. Styrofoam boxes can make great basic seed raising greenhouses when covered with clear plastic.

Mogareeka boat ramp

Construction of the Mogareeka boat ramp upgrade project began this week by Sydney specialist marine construction company GPM Pty Ltd. The new double lane boat ramp is located upstream of the existing

pontoon jetty and will be constructed on sleeved steel pile footings supporting precast concrete beams and

When the boat ramp is completed, Council will enlarge and upgrade the carpark, access road and launching area. Improved lighting and signage is also intended. The old boat ramp will be retained for launching non-powered personal craft such as canoes, kayaks, windsurfers etc.

The project is being jointly funded by Council and Transport for NSW under the NSW Boating Now program. The boat ramp construction will take approximately 10 weeks, and the carpark upgrade and associated works will take approximately six weeks. The existing boat ramp will remain operational throughout the construction period.

GPS surveys

Council is currently undertaking a GPS survey of water, sewer and drainage assets that may exist in people's backyards in the localities of Berrambool, Mirador, Pambula, South Pambula and Pambula Beach.

Council staff require clear access to any structures and, where practical, animals should be restrained. Residents should receive a letter advising them of the project and can be contacted for further information.

The team is also capturing assets along the Bega-Yellow Pinch and the Yellow Pinch to Pambula water trunk mains. They need to access people's properties where the trunk main runs through private property.

Towamba road works

Road widening works on Towamba Road are underway and will continue until Thursday 11 February. The works will be from the top of Towamba Mountain at Ben Boyd Road intersection heading west towards Towamba to the Snake Track intersection. No access will be permitted from 9am to 3.30pm, Monday 8 February to Thursday 11 February 2. Detour via Burragate, Wyndham to Mt Darragh Road will be available during these times.

Lifejacket van visits

The 'Old4New' van will be in the Shire this weekend as part of a Transport NSW program to change the perception that lifejackets are cumbersome and get in the way out on the water.
