## Bike path project on track

A cycle path connecting Tathra and Kalaru is set to become a reality by as early as mid-2019, with the planning phase of the project commencing recently.

Survey work and investigation studies are underway along Tathra Road and in the two townships, with the concept path alignment to begin at the bus stop in Kalaru and finish at Tathra Public School.

The project is to be entirely funded by a \$3,000,000 grant received from the State Government under the 2017/18 Active Transport Program and represents the first stage in creating a cycling network between Bega and Tathra.

Council's Acting Director of Transport and Utilities, Ian Macfarlane, said the project aligns with the vision and goals and short-term priority proposals of the Bega Valley Bike Plan.

"It is very exciting to see this project commencing and much credit should go to the Bega Tathra Safe Ride community group who have been instrumental in securing the funding," Mr Macfarlane said.

"The bike path certainly has strong support and we look forward to successfully delivering this project for the local community.

"The path will be located within the existing road reserve wherever possible and the alignment will be adjusted to suit the existing site topography and work around vegetation.

"It is envisaged that the path will provide connection into the existing mountain bike network and cater for cyclist of all abilities," Mr Macfarlane said.

The concept design will commence once the initial investigations have been completed later this month and a concept design will go on public exhibition for community comment early in 2018.

A staged construction of the bike path is planned to commence in mid-2018, with a target completion of mid-2019.

## **Council celebrating innovation award**

Bega Valley Shire Council is celebrating after receiving an award for innovation at the IPWEA NSW Engineering Excellence Awards on Thursday night.

The recognition comes after Council has beefed up the technology it uses for internal communication, project and asset management.

A comprehensive system known as a Network Operating Centre (NOC) has been developed internally, enabling data mining between Council's separate information management systems.

The concept originated from a need to manage intellectual property, with staff keen to reduce duplication and highlight opportunities that bring about greater collaboration and efficiency.

Council's Manager of Strategy and Assets, Jason Deller, said that the NOC allows staff (through the use of a touchscreen) to view all relevant information for a localised area, which in turn saves on transportation costs and maximises the efficiency of works personnel.

"There was a real focus on the transport network in developing the NOC and we now have the ability to view large quantities of data spatially across the Shire," Mr Deller said.

"Through utilising the NOC, Council is able to fully understand the complexities of transport servicing. Renewal and upgrade information is readily available and reflects the current 'real time' status of our network for tactical and operational workflow and future strategic planning.

"While still evolving, the system is already bringing great benefits including better project planning; displaying crash data statistics that guide funding applications and road improvement programs; displaying Council road grading schedules to determine level of service requirements and compliance; and minimising the loss of corporate knowledge.

"This is cutting edge technology and the use of drones for video and photographic evidence has been vital to the project, which enables Council to optimise value for money and deliver responsible, ethical spending and efficient service delivery," Mr Deller said.

In exciting news for the community, much of the information held within the NOC will be soon available through a new 'transport portal' on Council's website.

### Frogs Hollow flight school update

Planning staff at Bega Valley Shire Council have made a preliminary assessment of Development Application - 10-2017-445-1, which proposes a recreational flight school on land adjacent to the Princes Highway at Frogs Hollow.

The site is home to a longstanding airfield; however the applicant, Sports Aviation Flight College Australia is proposing a \$10.4 million investment.

Council officers have determined that all information needed for the application to be placed on exhibition has been submitted.

Submissions from the community will be accepted until 6 December.

In line with Schedule 4A of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act, Council will then forward the application to the Southern Joint Regional Planning Panel (SJRPP) for final determination. developments valued at over \$5 million to the SJRPP, this includes air transport facilities.

Council's role in this case will be to coordinate the exhibition period; on completion Council staff will compile an assessment report for the consideration of the SJRPP. Any submissions received during the 21 day exhibition period will be addressed in the staff report.

Planning Panels are an instrument of NSW Department of Planning and Environment and operate across the State to provide independent, merit-based decision making on regionally significant developments.

Former NSW Environment Minister, Pam Allan, is Chair of the SJRPP.

## **IRC Conference Dispute Concluded**

Bega Valley Shire Council (BVSC) representatives attended a second compulsory conference at the Industrial Relations Commission in Sydney this week, after the United Services Union (USU) sought to have the matter relisted.

Council was asked by the Commission, to provide further explanation on specific changes to positions directly impacted by the restructure when it appeared on 25 October, 2017. This material was provided to the Commission and the USU on 27 October, 2017.

In a statement provided to both parties at the conclusion of the conference, Commissioner Peter Newall said, on the basis of the material before the Commission and the facts that emerged in today's proceedings, it is clear that the restructure and regrading of positions by Council in this case has been correctly carried out.

Commissioner Newall further determined that he can see no basis for further disputation about the regrading and that the file on the dispute has now been closed.

The Commissioner also advised that Council was now able to undertake recruitment activity to fill the new roles.

Council is confident that it can now move forward and finalise the required organisation structure changes. Council acknowledges that change is difficult and will continue to provide support to affected employees through the change process.

## More plaudits for regional gallery
