


## Split trucks used to collect rubbish and recycling



There might be some confusion as to why one truck collects both waste and recycling. Rest assured, your hard work separating is not being wasted! The trucks are specifically designed to hold waste and recycling separately so they can be sorted individually.

You may have noticed that Council's rubbish collecting contractor, Cleanaway, uses one truck in some areas of the Shire to collect both waste rubbish and recycling. These split trucks separate waste and recycling into different compartments to be processed individually at different locations.

The split trucks have been used since 2005, and after they collect waste and recycling from your home, they go to the contractor's yard in Kerrison's Lane for sorting. Afterwards, the trucks travel to Bomaderry for recycled goods to be sorted and processed at Shoalhaven Recycling.

Items accepted for recycling include all plastic bottles, aluminium and steel tins and cans, glass bottles and jars (please no lids), juice and milk cartons, aerosol cans, newspapers and magazines, shredded paper, phone books, egg cartons, cardboard and plastic food trays and tubs.

Goods that can't be recycled include plastic bags, ceramics, crockery, mirrors, broken glass, contaminated paper (pizza boxes, serviettes), waxed paper, styrofoam, metal, oil or paint (including paint tins), food scraps and clothing.
