Shire works due to wet weather

The unprecedented weather events over the past few months have had a major impact on the infrastructure network of the Shire. Unsealed road surfaces have been washed away, bridges have debris on and jammed under their decks and potholes have formed on many of the sealed roads.

Teams have been out clearing, cleaning, repairing and assessing the damage to our infrastructure from these storms. This work all takes time. When all the information has been gathered the work is then prioritised for repairs.

Council is aware of the situation and advises residents that works have commenced in many areas.

This work will be ongoing for some time and we ask that residents be patient with the smaller, less critical repairs. These repairs will be addressed in time.

Roadside slashing has also been impacted. The wet weather and unseasonal growth rate means many of the road verges have not been able to be maintained. This will be addressed over the coming weeks depending on the weather conditions also.

Warning against picking blackberries

Berry lovers should avoid the temptation to pick blackberries on roadsides and public land in the Bega Valley Shire.

The flowering and fruiting period of blackberries is also an effective time to control them, as they are a class 4 noxious weed.

While some contractors put warning signs up or use dye in their herbicide to inform people of sprayed areas, none of these measures are compulsory.

Unless you are absolutely sure that the blackberries you are picking have not been sprayed, Council's advice is to steer clear.

If you suspect you or anyone you know may have ingested herbicide, contact your local healthcare professional for advice.
